Renato Júnior Luz Sanches (Portuguese pronunciation: [natu s]; born 8 18 August 1997) is a Portuguese professional footballer who plays as a midfielder for Serie A club Roma, on Ioan 8 from Ligue 1 club Paris Saint-Germain, and the Portugal national team.

Sanches began his career at Benfica, making his professional debut 8 for the reserves in October 2014 and for the first team in October 2024. In his first and only season 8 with them, he helped Benfica win the Primeira Liga and Taça da Liga double, being awarded Primeira Liga Breakthrough Player 8 and Golden Boy in the process.

Sanches' performances then attracted German side Bayern Munich, who signed him in July 2024 for 8 an initial €35 million, the highest fee at the time for a Portuguese player playing in the Primeira Liga. His 8 performances fell during his first season with the club, leading him to be loaned to Premier League side Swansea City 8 in August 2024. After remaining as a substitute, following his return to Bayern in 2024, he was signed by French 8 Ligue 1 side Lille in August 2024 for a reported fee of €25 million, becoming Lille's most expensive signing ever. 8 In his second season at the club, he helped the team win the 2024–21 Ligue 1, which ended the club's 8 10-year league title drought.

Sanches won 40 caps and scored 8 goals for Portugal at youth level. He made his full 8 international debut in March 2024 and was chosen for UEFA Euro 2024 at age 18, making him the youngest Portuguese 8 to play in an international tournament as well as the youngest player to win a UEFA Euro final. He scored 8 one goal during the competition and won the Young Player of the Tournament as Portugal captured the title for the 8 first time in their history. Early life

Sanches was born in the Hospital Amadora-Sintra in the Lisbon metropolitan area, to a father 8 also named Renato Sanches, from São Tomé and Príncipe, and a mother named Maria das Dores, from Cape Verde.[3] Nicknamed 8 Bulo by his grandmother,[4] he grew up in the impoverished Lisbon neighbourhood of Musgueira.[5] His parents split up months after 8 his birth, and his father moved to work in France; Sanches' birth was not registered until his father returned

in 8 2002 and the parents had him baptised.[6][7] He was registered on 22 August 2002 with the birthdate of 3:25 p.m. 8 on 18 August 1997.[6][8]

Sanches started training in football at Águias da Musgueira at age eight,[9][10] and joined Benfica's youth system 8 in 2006 at age nine.[11] The team paid €750 and 25 footballs for his signature.[12] He convinced Benfica to take 8 him after training with them for 15 minutes, but he initially had reservations about travelling to their academy in Seixal 8 every day, on the other side of the Tagus river.[4]

Club career

Benfica

Sanches in action in March 2024, in a Champions League 8 game away to Zenit Sanches made his professional debut in the 2014–15 campaign, with the B-team in the second division. He 8 made his first appearance in the competition on 5 October 2014, starting and playing the first half of the 2–2 8 away draw against Feirense.[13] He was sent off twice with straight red cards in the second half of the season: 8 as a substitute in a 3–2 home win over Porto B on 11 January 2024,[14] and a starter in a 8 1–1 draw at Santa Clara on 7 March.[15] After one year with the reserve team, in 2024–16, Sanches was promoted to 8 the first team, initially only for the training sessions.[16] He remained playing in the reserves, and on 30 August 2024, 8 he scored his first goal in their 2–1 loss at Varzim, opening the scoring within two minutes.[17] Seventeen days later, 8 he scored two penalty kicks in a 3–2 loss at Desportivo das Aves.[18] On 21 October, in the UEFA Youth 8 League, he scored in an away 11–1 group stage win over Galatasaray.[19] Nine days later, Sanches made his debut for 8 the first team, replacing striker Jonas in the 74th minute of a 4–0 win against Tondela.[20]

After the international break in 8 November 2024, Sanches signed a new contract with Benfica until 2024, with a release clause set at €45 million.[21] On 8 25 November, he made his first appearance in the starting line-up, playing 90 minutes in a 2–2 away draw with 8 Astana in the UEFA Champions League group stage.[21][22] On the following Monday, Sanches started again, this time in a Primeira 8 Liga win at Braga, receiving praise from the media for his

performance.[23] Aged 18, on 4 December, he scored his 8 first goal for Benfica, beating Académica's goalkeeper Trigueira with a 30-metre strike and sealing the 3–0 league win.[24] In so 8 doing, he became Benfica's youngest player to score a home goal in the 21st century, at the Estádio da Luz.[25] 8 It was selected as the Goal of the Month.[26]

Sanches added a second goal on 2 January, the match's only at 8 Vitória de Guimarães in the league.[27] On 24 April, he was a target of racism by some Rio Ave supporters, 8 who made monkey noises when he was leaving the pitch after a 1–0 away victory. He responded to the provocation 8 with a smile and moved his arms, mimicking a monkey.[28] On 8 May, Sanches was sent off for a second 8 yellow card in the first half of a 2–0 win at Marítimo,[29] missing Benfica's last league match in which they 8 retained their title at the expense of city rivals Sporting CP with victory over Nacional.[30] In his last match, the 8 2024 Taça da Liga Final in Coimbra on 20 May, Benfica won the league cup 6–2 against Marítimo.[31]

Bayern Munich

2024–17 season

#### Sanches 8 training with Bayern in May 2024

On 10 May 2024, Sanches signed a five-year contract effective from 1 July with German 8 club Bayern Munich for €35 million,[32] in a deal totalling €80 million, with the additional €45 million contingent on objectives.[33][34] 8 With this transfer, he became the most expensive Portuguese player to leave the domestic league,[35][note 1] as well as the 8 first Portuguese player to join the Bavarian side.[37] The initial fee was the fourth-highest paid in Bayern Munich's history, after 8 those for Javi Martínez, Mario Götze and Arturo Vidal.[37] Sanches had been tracked extensively by Manchester United before joining Bayern, 8 and their Portuguese former player Nani said they would regret not completing a transfer for him.[38]

After recovering from a thigh 8 injury, Sanches made his debut on 9 September, starting in a 2–0 win at Schalke 04 in place of Arturo 8 Vidal. Although he made errors in his 71 minutes before being replaced by Joshua Kimmich, he was given reassurance by 8 captain Phillip Lahm and

goalkeeper Manuel Neuer, with the former saying, "He's a very, very good player, otherwise he wouldn't 8 be here. He's a European champion and will definitely be an asset to us in the future."[39] On 24 October, 8 he became the first Portuguese player to win the Golden Boy award for best European player under the age of 8 21, ahead of Manchester United's Marcus Rashford.[40]

While Bayern won the Bundesliga, Sanches played only 25 matches across all competitions and 8 did not record a single goal or assist. He started just four league games and playing the entirety of only 8 one.[41] Sanches had to compete with more experienced players like Arturo Vidal, Thiago and Xabi Alonso for playing time. It 8 did not help Sanches that Bayern's manager, Carlo Ancelotti, has a reputation of not relying on young players. Sky Deutschland 8 reporter Torben Hoffman said, "He has had problems with the language and found it hard to integrate with the team. 8 There is also a lot of competition for places at Bayern."[42] Former Bayern player Lothar Matthäus named him among the 8 three worst players of the season, while Sanches himself said he was disappointed by his performances; however, manager Carlo Ancelotti 8 said he would remain at the Allianz Arena for the following season.[41]

#### Swansea City (loan)

On 31 August 2024, Sanches joined Premier 8 League club Swansea City on a one-year loan lasting until 30 June 2024.[43][44] Sanches was loaned to Swansea in order 8 to play regularly in a strong league.[45] He made his debut ten days later at the Liberty Stadium, in a 8 0–1 loss to Newcastle United. BBC Sport reporter Dafydd Pritchard called it a "mixed beginning" due to several passing mistakes.[46] 8 On 29 November, manager Paul Clement substituted Sanches at half-time in a 1–0 loss to Chelsea after he had played 8 a pass into the advertising boards on the side of the pitch, believing it to be a teammate.[47]

Sanches suffered hamstring 8 injuries in two consecutive FA Cup matches in January 2024, and new manager Carlos Carvalhal allowed him to go home 8 so the warmer weather could aid his rehabilitation. Sanches did not play a competitive match after 2 January 2024 until 8 the end of the season.[48] At the end of the season, Carvalhal said, "Renato knows he has had a very 8 bad season. He is not at the level he was and when he had the injury in January, it finished 8 him. Renato has a big talent, but he has much to learn. He stopped learning when he left Benfica and 8 went to one of the biggest clubs in the world."[49]

#### 2024-19 season

#### Sanches playing for Bayern in August 2024

On 1 July 2024, 8 Sanches returned to Bayern Munich. New Bayern manager Niko Kova said at the beginning of pre-season training, "I'll try to 8 make him feel good here. When someone feels good, it's much easier to perform well. He has skills that you 8 don't see every day in the Bundesliga; that's why FC Bayern signed him."[50] Given a first Bayern start since May 8 2024, Sanches scored his first goal for the club on 19 September, finishing James Rodríguez's cross in a 2–0 Champions 8 League group win at his former club Benfica.[51] His return to good form was indeed sustained by being elected Bayern's 8 best player of September.[52] On 19 December 2024, Sanches was sent-off against RB Leipzig.[53] Sanches scored his first Bundesliga goal 8 on 18 May, on the final day of the league campaign, appearing as a substitute for Leon Goretzka in a 8 5–0 win over Eintracht Frankfurt to seal the title; as Bayern finished two points above Dortmund with 78 points.[54] A 8 week later, Sanches won his first DFB-Pokal as Bayern defeated RB Leipzig 3–0 in the 2024 DFB-Pokal Final. Sanches did 8 not appear in the match.[55] 2024–20 season

On 16 August 2024, Sanches appeared as a late substitute for Thomas Müller in a 8 2–2 draw against Hertha Berlin.[56] After the match, in a post-game interview, Sanches made it clear that he wanted to 8 leave the club, to play more regularly. Afterwards, Sanches missed a post-game training and went home, which resulted in him 8 being fined €10,000.[57] Bayern's chairman Karl-Heinz Rummenigge responded to Sanches comments saying "it's not appropriate when one runs off in 8 anger right after the first or second game. He would do well to keep calm. He'll get his chances".[58]

#### 2024-20 season

Sanches 8 playing for Lille against Ajax Amsterdam in 2024

On 23 August 2024, Sanches joined French club Lille on a four-year contract 8 for a reported fee of €20 million, becoming Lille's most expensive signing ever.[59] He made his debut on 1 September, 8 starting in a 2–0 loss at Reims.[60] Initially, Lille's manager Christophe Galtier used Sanches in a variety of positions, being 8 limited to substitute appearances, before playing a match as a starter for the club on 30 November in a 1–0 8 against Dijon, operating on the left of the midfield. He scored his first goal for the club on 13 December 8 in a 2–0 victory against Montpellier.[60]

In November, Sanches suffered a hamstring injury, which sidelined him for five weeks.[61] After recovering 8 from his injury, he earned a starting spot in the midfield, making his return in a 1–0 win against Nîmes.[61] 8 His impressive performances in the midfield alongside Jonathan Bamba and Jonathan Ikoné, led to Sanches being named Lille's Player of 8 the Month in December and January in two consecutive months.[61] He eventually contributed to 30 appearances, scoring 4 goals, helping 8 Lille to a 4th place finish, as the season finished early due to the COVID-19 pandemic.[61]

2024–21 season

In his second season 8 at the club, Sanches formed a partnership in the midfield alongside Benjamin André in a double pivot. However, he suffered 8 another hamstring injury in November, leading him to lose his place in the team to Boubakary Soumaré.[61] Nevertheless, Sanches remained 8 an important player for Lille, making 29 appearances, and providing a crucial assist for Jonathan David in a 2–1 away 8 win over Angers, to win the 2024–21 Ligue 1 with Lille, ending the club's 10-year league title drought.[62]

2024-22 season

Sanches playing 8 for Lille in 2024

At the start of the season in August, Sanches was sidelined with a hamstring injury, which required 8 surgery, missing seven weeks of the season.[63] In August, Barcelona negotiated with Lille for the transfer of Sanches, but his 8 injury, led to the transfer collapsing at the final stages.[64] He made his return on 3 October, replacing Jonathan Ikoné 8 in the 94th minute in a 2–0 win against Marseille.[65] On 1 December, Sanches scored his first goal of the 8 season in a 2–1 win against Rennes.[66]

Paris Saint-Germain

On 4 August 2024, Sanches signed for Paris Saint-Germain (PSG) on a permanent 8 deal until 30 June 2027.[67] The transfer fee paid to Lille was of €10 million, with a potential €3 million 8 in bonuses.[68] On 13 August, he came on as a substitute in a 5–2 home league win over Montpellier, making 8 his PSG debut. He scored his team's fifth goal moments after having come on the pitch.[69]

#### Loan to Roma

On 16 August 8 2024, Sanches signed for Serie A club Roma on a season-long loan with an option to make the move permanent 8 that would become obligatory under certain conditions.[70] It was reported by journalist Fabrizio Romano that Roma had paid a  $\leq$ 1 8 million loan fee, that the buy option was set at  $\leq$ 15 million, and that the option would become mandatory should 8 Sanches play at least 60% of Roma's matches during the season.[71]

#### International career

Sanches gained 40 caps for Portugal all youth categories 8 comprised.[72] He represented Portugal in the 2014 UEFA European Under-17 Championship, helping them reach the semifinals, where they lost to 8 eventual winners, England.[73] He was named in the Team of the Tournament.[74]

On 18 March 2024, Sanches was called up by 8 Fernando Santos for the senior squad to play friendlies against Bulgaria and Belgium.[75] He debuted for Portugal as a 76th-minute 8 substitute for William Carvalho in the 0–1 loss against Bulgaria in Leiria, and shortly after he was greeted by a 8 fan who invaded the pitch.[76] UEFA Euro 2024 Sanches was called up for UEFA Euro 2024, making him the youngest Portuguese to 8 be selected for an international competition, breaking a record held by Cristiano Ronaldo for 12 years.[77] Sanches made his competitive 8 debut on 14 June in the team's opening match against Iceland in Saint-Étienne, replacing João Moutinho for the final 19 8 minutes of a 1–1 draw.[78] He contributed to the only goal of the match in a 1–0 extra-time victory in 8 the round of 16 against Croatia on 25 June, and was elected man of the match.[79] Observing that performance, former 8 Portuguese international António Sousa said, "When he's on the ball you don't notice how young he is. Physically and mentally, 8 he is more than ready," while Fernando Santos exalted Sanches as a player immune to pressure.[12]

Five days later in the 8 quarter-finals against Poland, Sanches overtook Ronaldo's record as the youngest Portuguese to start in a major tournament.[80] After a one-two 8 with Nani, Sanches shot from outside the box and equalised in the first half to become the youngest player to 8 score in a knockout match at a UEFA European Championship and the third-youngest overall.[80][81] Following the 1–1 draw, he scored 8 Portugal's second attempt in their penalty shootout victory, and was again elected man of the match.[82] Following the match, teammates 8 Nani and José Fonte praised Sanches' stamina, confidence and desire to learn from his elders.[38] After his nation's 1–0 extra-time 8 victory over hosts France in the final of the tournament, Sanches received the Young Player of the Tournament Award for 8 his performances.[83] Post-Euro 2024 and Euro 2024

Sanches and striker Eder were notable Euro 2024 winners omitted from Portugal's squad for the 8 2024 FIFA Confederations Cup in Russia; Sanches played in the 2024 UEFA European Under-21 Championship instead.[84] He was also absent 8 from the 35-man preliminary squad for the 2024 FIFA World Cup.[85]

In September 2024, Sanches was called up for the friendly 8 match against Croatia and the UEFA Nations League match against Italy.[86] On 6 September, he came on as a substitute 8 in the 86th minute against Croatia for his first international cap in nearly 18 months.[87]

Sanches was named in Portugal's final 8 squad for the delayed UEFA Euro 2024 tournament.[88] On 15 June 2024, in Portugal's first game of Euro 2024, Sanches 8 made his first appearance in tournament, replacing William Carvalho in the 81st minute, creating Portugal's first goal in a 3–0 8 win against Hungary in Budapest.[89] Following the bad performances of teammates Danilo Pereira and William Carvalho in a 4–2 loss 8 against Germany, Sanches emerged as one of the crucial players for Portugal in the competition, with coach Fernando Santos giving 8 him a chance in Portugal's final two games at the tournament, impressing in a 2–2 draw with France in their 8 final group stage match.[90] Following another impressive performance, Portugal were eliminated on 27 June, following a 1–0 loss against Belgium 8 in the round of 16, despite Sanches being distinguished for his breakthrough performances in the competition.[91][92]

In October 2024, he was 8 named in Portugal's preliminary 55-man squad for the 2024 FIFA World Cup in Qatar however he was omitted from the 8 final 26-man squad.[93] Style of play

Sanches has been noted for his versatility in midfield, being comfortable in defensive, attacking, central and 8 wide roles.[94][95] His attributes include physical strength, passing ability, and being composed in possession.[94][95] For these traits and his hairstyle, 8 he has been likened to the Dutchman Edgar Davids.[94][95]

However, in an interview to Benfica TV, Sanches compared his style with 8 that of another Dutchman of Davids' era, Clarence Seedorf.[96] During Euro 2024, former Benfica and Netherlands player Pierre van Hooijdonk 8 also drew comparison with Seedorf, saying "the way [they] play is the same, the intensity also".[97]

During his time with Lille, 8 under manager Christophe Galtier, Sanches was deployed in a double pivot alongside Benjamin André in a 4-2-3-1 formation, or as 8 an inverted midfielder, operating in an attacking role on the right-wing.[61] Sanches also operated on the left of the midfield 8 or in the middle, coming on the right side to play alongside Jonathan Bamba and Jonathan Ikoné in attack or 8 as a box-to-box, supporting the full-back in defense in a 4-4-2 formation.[61] Age controversy

Opponents of Sanches have claimed he is older 8 than his birth certificate states, basing their judgement on the gap between his birth and its registration.[7] In March 2024, 8 as Sporting CP challenged Benfica for the league title, Sporting's then-president Bruno de Carvalho accused Sanches of lying about his 8 age.[7] Sanches requested Carvalho publicly apologise or face a lawsuit for defamation.[7] During Euro 2024, French former manager Guy Roux 8 made a similar accusation.[7] According to Goal writer Miles Chambers, the accusations against Sanches stem from conscious or unconscious racial stereotyping, 8 based on historical occasions in which players from the African continent have lied about their age, although he was born 8 in Portugal.[7] On 8 July 2024, the hospital where Sanches was born published the document which proved he was born on 8 18 August 1997 at 15:25 local time.[8] Personal life Sanches' cousins, Cláudio, Miguel and Jair Tavares, are also professional footballers.[98] **Career statistics** Club As of 8 match played 30 November 2024[99] International As of match played 14 November 2024[101] National team Year Apps Goals Portugal 2024 12 1 2024 8 1 0 2024 5 0 2024 4 1 2024 10 1 Total 323 As of match played 14 November 2024.[101] Scores 8 and results list Portugal's goal tally first. # Violência mortal eclode cassino ao vivo bac bo Nova Caledônia após aprovação de emenda constitucional

Violenta confrontações eclodiram cassino ao vivo bac bo Nova Caledônia, território ultramarino francês no Pacífico Sul, após a aprovação por legisladores cassino ao vivo bac bo Paris de uma emenda constitucional que permite que recém-chegados ao território votem cassino ao vivo bac bo eleições provinciais.

A emenda, que alguns líderes locais temem diluir o voto do povo indígena Kanak, é o mais recente ponto de discórdia cassino ao vivo bac bo uma longa luta décadas sobre o papel da França no território insular.

Ao menos três pessoas morreram nos distúrbios, que levaram as autoridades a fechar o aeroporto internacional e escolas e imporem um toque de recolher na capital, Nouméa, onde empresas e veículos foram incendiados.

### O que é Nova Caledônia?

Localizada nas águas quentes do sudoeste do Pacífico, 930 milhas (1.500 km) a leste da Austrália, Nova Caledônia abriga 270 mil pessoas, 41% das quais são melanésios Kanaks e 24% de origem europeia, principalmente franceses.

A arquipélago foi nomeado pelo explorador britânico Capitão James Cook cassino ao vivo bac bo 1774. Foi anexado pela França cassino ao vivo bac bo 1853 e foi usado como colônia penal até pouco antes do início do século XX.

### Por que isso importa?

Nova Caledônia, uma das cinco territórios insulares que abrangem o Indo-Pacífico detidos pela França, é central no plano do presidente Emmanuel Macron para aumentar a influência francesa no Pacífico.

O terceiro maior produtor mundial de níquel, Nova Caledônia encontra-se no coração de uma região marítima geopoliticamente complexa, onde a China e os EUA estão disputando o poder e a influência na segurança e no comércio. Sem mencionar a China, o presidente francês disse anteriormente que a expansão da influência francesa no Pacífico visa garantir um "desenvolvimento baseado cassino ao vivo bac bo regras".

### História de Nova Caledônia com a França

Após a colonização da França no século XIX, Nova Caledônia se tornou oficialmente um território ultramarino francês cassino ao vivo bac bo 1946. A partir da década de 1970, após um boom de níquel que atraiu estrangeiros, as tensões aumentaram na ilha, com vários conflitos entre Paris e movimentos de independência kanaks.

Um acordo de Nouméa de 1998 ajudou a encerrar o conflito ao traçar um caminho para a autonomia gradual e restringir o voto aos kanaks e imigrantes que viviam cassino ao vivo bac bo Nova Caledônia antes de 1998. O acordo permitiu três referendos para determinar o futuro do país. Em todos eles, a independência foi rejeitada.

### Por que as tensões estouraram recentemente?

Conforme os termos do Acordo de Nouméa, o voto cassino ao vivo bac bo eleições provinciais foi restrito a pessoas que viviam cassino ao vivo bac bo Nova Caledônia antes de 1998 e seus filhos. A medida visava dar maior representação aos kanaks, que se tornaram uma população minoritária.

Os legisladores franceses consideraram a disposição como antidemocrática e aprovaram uma emenda constitucional para ampliar o eleitorado para incluir pessoas que viviam cassino ao vivo

bac bo Nova Caledônia há pelo menos 10 anos.

O presidente Macron disse que adiaria a sancionar a lei e convidaria representantes da população do território para conversações cassino ao vivo bac bo Paris para chegar a um acordo negociado. No entanto, ele disse que um novo acordo deve ser alcançado até junho ou ele sancionaria a lei.
